During the third year of the pandemic, UNICEF supported the strengthening of measures to mitigate COVID-19 effects and increased capacity building for health facility personnel to ensure essential health services continuity and facilitate timely access to quality health services for children, adolescents and their families.

Children and their families benefited from having access to more comprehensive care through the health sector's service with UNICEF's contributions reaching 100% of health centres nationwide improving immunizations, maternal and child health, nutrition and adolescent health programmes, in partnership with state institutions and community-based organizations.
