UNICEF–Burundi continued to strengthen the capacity of the Government to secure an enabling environment for the implementation of key high-impact interventions. Several national strategic documents on health and nutrition were developed, reviewed, approved, signed and launched. Advocacy resulted in increased government budget allocations for immunization in 2021–2023, from US\$400,000 in 2021 to US\$1 million in 2022 and US\$1.3 million in 2023. UNICEF–Burundi supported decentralized and central sectoral and multisectoral health and nutrition coordination mechanisms and conducted evidence generation through assessments, surveys and research.
