CLAC/climate surveys indicating 37 per cent households have access to safely managed sanitation and 60 per cent to water services helped inform the national costed plan. UNICEF's demonstration of WASH hardware/software mitigation and adaptation measures to climate change provided evidence for scaling in communities. Remote monitoring and management of water resources were strengthened through installation of sensors in community boreholes and technical capacity building for online management and monitoring of water quality. UNICEF coordinated information sharing between Federal Iraq and KRI which resulted in advanced technical capacity in KRI; and building academic partnerships to improve skills of young engineers.
