UNICEF WASH Programme continued to support provision of essential water supply and sanitation services to Syrian refugee populations residing in informal settlements, along with construction of strategic WASH infrastructure in Lebanese host community providing job opportunities for Syrian and Lebanese populations. The public water supply and wastewater systems were severely affected by limited power availability. UNICEF continued to support essential repair and maintenance to keep the water flowing. A major cholera outbreak affecting both Syrian refugees and Lebanese host community necessitated a large-scale WASH response.
