Full Output Statement: 1.5 Improved maternal, adolescent, infant, and young child nutrition, and prevention of malnutrition and increased ability to detect, which contributes to Child Health, Early Detection And Treatment Of Malnutrition, Evaluation, Health And Development In Early Childhood And Adolescence, Health And Emergencies, Health Systems Strengthening, Health – General, Immunization, Immunization Services As Part Of Primary Health Care, Infant And Young Child Feeding, Maternal And Newborn Health, Mental Health And Psychosocial Well-Being, Micronutrients, Nutrition And Emergencies, Nutrition In Early Childhood, Nutrition Of Adolescents And Women, Nutrition – General, Polio Eradication, Research, Strengthening Primary Health Care And High-Impact Health Interventions. UNICEF aims to achieve this through Advocacy And Communications, Advocacy And Public Engagement, Data, Research, Evaluation And Knowledge Management, Evaluations, Research And Data, Systems Strengthening And Institution Building, Systems Strengthening To Leave No One Behind. In 2022, UNICEF has reached over 320,000 children under-5 and their caregivers with essential nutrition interventions; including screening and referral for malnutrition (270,000 children under 5 and 44,000 pregnant and lactating women), Social Behavior Change interventions for IYCF (234,000) and enhanced the access to quality nutrition counseling for 63,000 caregivers and provision of micronutrient supplements to 78,467 children and women. UNICEF in partnership with MOPH and other ministries, organized the first national roundtable on Nutrition to augment the profile of nutrition in development and humanitarian agenda, and this resulted in expansion of the nutrition sector to Lebanon's major response plan.
