UNICEF coordinated emergency response that benefitted around 2,000,000 people affected by cholera and floods. UNICEF accomplished this with specific WASH, Child Protection, PSEA and GBV services. Additionally, over 370,000 community members benefitted from climate-resilient water supply provision, and 76,422 additional people received access to basic sanitation services through UNICEF-supported programmes. UNICEF has supported the Government in providing cash transfers to 303,800 vulnerable households through the SCTP. Additional cash transfers were also provided to 283,000 households (650,219 children) during the 2022/23 Lean Season Response and Cyclone Freddy Early Recovery Response
