Full Output Statement: By 2022, duty-bearers, including government sector departments, implementing partners and CSOs, have the capacity and systems to deliver equitable, gender-responsive safely managed water and sanitation services, including in schools and in early childhood development centres and health-care facilities, and in emergency situations., which contributes to Climate Change, Disaster Risks And Environmental Degradation, Cross Sectoral - Children With Disabilities, Safe And Equitable Water, Sanitation And Hygiene Services And Practices, Safe And Equitable Water, Sanitation And Hygiene Services And Practices (Covid), Water, Sanitation And Hygiene Systems And Empowerment Of Communities. UNICEF aims to achieve this through Developing And Leveraging Resources And Partnerships, Harnessing Power Of Business And Markets, Systems Strengthening And Institution Building, Systems Strengthening To Leave No One Behind. Through UNICEF technical and financial support, over 2,316,765 people (1,153,947 males and 1,162,818 females) gained access to at least basic water, at least 1,619,770 people (807,650 males; 812,120 females) gained access to basic sanitation during both development and humanitarian programming. As a result, an additional 4,030,820 people are now living in ODF communities. A total of 970 schools and 236 health care facilities were provided with gender responsive and disability inclusive WASH services. Thereby contributing towards infection prevention and control within institutions.
