To ensure more people in targeted rural and poor urban areas have access to sustainable and affordable safely managed WASH services, UNICEF reached an estimated 730,263 (99 per cent of target) people, of whom 153,000 are women and 442,000 are children, with access to basic drinking water services. To prevent the spread of diseases (diarrhoea, cholera, typhoid, dysentery) which affect the physical and mental development of children, UNICEF's rural sanitation flagship project for the attainment of Open Defecation Free (ODF) communities reached 17,100 (34 per cent of the target) people and 46 (out of the planned 50) villages certified ODF
