In 2023, UNICEF supported development and cabinet approval of three critical laws - Child Rights, Juvenile Justice and Civil Registry and Vital Statistics bills. In a year of multiple emergencies, the investment in systems strengthening and capacities of child protection services contributed to building a protective environment for children. UNICEF supported the drafting of a 5-year national plan of action for children. Other initiatives supported at various levels of Government include development of action plan of Alternative Care Policy in Somaliland, community-based diversion mechanisms for restorative justice and scale up and deployment of social work at state level.
