Despite the complex programming environment, the joint Government/UNICEF WASH program contributed to 288,000 emergency-affected and rural vulnerable people realizing their right to sanitation. Of these, 124,000 individuals benefitted from 130 communities having eradicated open defecation and being certified as Open Defecation Free (ODF). Around 2.5 million Sudanese also gained knowledge and skills on handwashing practices and water chlorination methods at community and household levels. Distribution of WASH supplies also played a critical role in UNICEF's response to mass displacement, flooding and cholera outbreak, with around 276,000 people benefitting from this initiative.
