Despite the complex operational environment, the joint Government-UNICEF WASH Programme contribution towards increasing access to improved drinking water in Sudan was still significant, representing a lifeline for individuals on the move, refugees, as well as communities experiencing active conflict and/or hosting a large number of IDPs. In total, 5.91 million people benefitted from improved water supply, with 552,000 gaining access to water through construction/rehabilitation of water sources and 5.36 million benefitting from water chlorination, water services operation and maintenance, as well as water trucking. Additionally, 44 schools and 28 health care facilities/nutrition centres were provided with water supply systems.
